OBITUARY.

JOHN FIDO died at Columbus, Ohio and was buried in Greenlawn Cemetery, on Sunday, July 24th, 1881. He was born in the Parish of Whitburne, Herefordshire, England, September 18th 1796, and was consequently in his 85th year. At an early age he joined the British Naval Service and afterwards enlisted in the British army, serving TEASDELS his country about soventeen years. He traveled in most parts of the world and in 1844 settled in Columbus. But he did not remain there long, his desire for change inducing him to visit many parts of the United States. He embraced the gospel, and in Nauvoo he became acquaintee with the prophet Joseph, the Patriarch Hyrunn, and Presidents Brigham Young and John Taylor. He subsequently went to Eng-land and, returning, took up his abode again in Columbus, where he died in full faith of the gospel, expressing his desire to be record-

ed in the patriarchal order. He was a kind husband, a good companion and a brave soldier .-- [Cost. by R. H. Roberts.]
