

FIGHT WITH SNAKE INDIANS.

William Logan, Indian agent at the Warm Springs Reserve, says the Portland Oregonian, has received the following letter from J. G. Campbell, schoolmaster at the Reserve, giving the details of another fight with the Snakes. Donald McKay's Indians are a party of forty or fifty made up at the Reserve to accompany Capt. Drake's command, and were under the lead of McKay and Stock Whitney:

WARM SPRING AGENCY, May 22, 1864.

DEAR SIR: Donald McKay, with a few of the Indians, has just arrived from Capt. Drake's command. Donald says that about 30 miles from here (the reserve) his party of Indians came upon Snake tracks. They succeeded in finding the Indians, and sent back word to Capt. Drake for sixty men; after some delay, he sent thirty—a number entirely inadequate for the service. These troops came up with Donald's party about daylight, when they charged the Snakes with a view to cutting them off from a rocky knoll. Lieut. Watson, who led the charge at the head of a small body of his men, was shot in the head, and subsequently horribly mutilated. By some strange mistake, Lieut. McCall, in command with his party of men did not get into the fight and was never under fire. One of Donald's Indians was killed; Old Stock Whitney was shot in three places, and is badly wounded; Barker, an expressman, who went out with George Rundell, had his thigh broken by shot; of the soldiers, two were killed in the fight and five wounded. The whites were defeated but recovered the dead bodies after the battle. The party took some sixty or seventy horses from the Snakes; of these Captain Drake took all the best, leaving the Indians but twenty-eight poor horses.

POSTAL MONEY-ORDER SYSTEM.—Congress has passed a law to establish a system of money orders from one post office to another. The Bill provides that any sum not less than one nor more than thirty dollars may be paid to any postmaster who must give an order for that sum. This order is sent by mail to any place and is payable by any postmaster. The bonus to be paid for the orders are: ten cents for an order of \$10 or less; 15 cents for an order of \$20, or less, and 20 for an order of \$30 or less.
