Down with the Rowdies! Bonner, of the New York Ledger, reads his metropolitan patrons the following lecture on rowdyism, that would not have a far-fetched application if rehearsed in this part of Utah Territory-more especially since the oriental 'civilization' code of morals and manners were imported here from that populous section of the North American continent lying in the direction from whence the sun rises: The rowdy is a singularly hateful, though usually a harmless animal. He is always a great fool, very ignorant and very cowardly. One-half the rowdies merely affect rowdyism, under the delusion that to commit wickedness and to outrage decency is at once to exhibit spirit, and to prove that, like the great, lamented Poole, they are 'true Americans.' We have even seen young Germans making the most arduous and ludicrous attempts to imitate the rakish air and loud talk of the more accomplished members of the fraternity. The ordinary effect of rowdyism is to deprive virtuous people of part of their liberty. lust as the two hundred thousand virtuous women among us are prevented from walking abroad in the evening unprotected, solely that the two thousand bad women may flaunt their dirty silks in the glare of Broadway, so the multitude of the well-behaved of our citizens are deterred from frequenting many places of agreeable resort, merely because rowdies are wont to assemble at such places and render them disgusting. New York is, of all our cities, the one least afflicted with rowdies. New York is the most orderly city of its size in the world. But even here, where the policeman is held in respect, and where he usually does his duty, we are not wholly free from the outrages of this deplorable class. How many of our citizens deny their families the pleasure of boys in Albany. One of them, a pupil in one ney Island, Fort Hamilton, Staten Island, the Highbridge, Jones's Woods, Harlem, all so delightful at this season, for fear some small gang of rowdies may be there defiling God's open air and green woods with their horrid orgies. This fear, we admit, is generally not realized. But it ought not to exist. There ought to be no ground for it. Those pleasant places should be sucred to order, to peace, to affection, to innocent pleasure. We go for war against rowdies. Down
