THE TEMPLE AT ST. GEORGE.
 A BRIEF HISTORY OF ITS ERECTION.

The following memoranda of the building of the Temple at St. George, are kindly furnished by Chief Mason E. L. Parry:
 The ground was dedicated by President B. Young, on the 9th of November, 1871. The first stone was laid March 10th, 1878. The foundation was dug 10 feet deep below the present grade. In digging, the greater part was found to be hard and solid, but in places that it was necessary to dig a drain around the outside 12 feet from the building, a little below the bottom of the foundation. The main drain was 50 feet east of the square tower. It was so soft in places that a fence post could be pushed into the ground. This caused considerable anxiety as to the best way of making it substantial enough to sustain the structure. B. Young concluded to have the foundation dug 12 feet wide and to put in the bottom a thick layer of small-stone rock and drive them down with a 900 pound sledge-hammer. On top of this, the black rock was laid in 12 feet long, and three to four feet wide 12 to 15 inches thick, weighing 40 to 75 hundred lbs; each laid and watertight. The walls were graded up to the top of the window sills in the basement. They were three feet eight inches thick at the bottom and gradually diminishing in width until the roof timbers were reached, being two feet eight inches at the top.

The stone quarries were found by President Brigham Young. There was no other rock suitable to resist the action of the water, causing limestone and particles of sandstone to decay. The rock was brought from the west side of the black rock west of St. George. The amount of rock used was 17,000 tons. The most of the lumber was brought from Mt. Tremblay, a distance of 65 or 70 miles. The timbers were cut from Pine Valley Mountain.

There are 11 rooms in the basement. The first main room above the basement is 78 x 99 feet with ceiling being 27 feet from the main floor. On each side of the main part of the main room 16 feet from the floor, are eight rooms, each 11 feet wide by 12 feet 4 inches and 10 feet high. The second main and side rooms are duplicates of the first.

The baptismal font in the basement is of iron and cost \$5,000 at the foundry in Salt Lake City, 380 miles from St. George, and was donated by President Young. The font is 48 inches high, is 18,000 pounds. The font room is 35 x 40 feet.
