Our trip was a pleasant one both going and coming. On account of the late rain we encountered no dust except between Alma and Kelton. We found many friends and acquaintances and had a most pleasant time visiting with the people. While in Oakley we visited the flower garden of Sister Worthington. It is a beauty, and will compare with some of the best in Utah, notwithstanding Sister Worthington is living in a new country and has been there not quite ten months.
