He Cannot Speak English nor Can He Find His Mother or Friends.

A strange German lad, fourteen years of age, came in from Park City on the Utah Central this morning. He was unable to speak a word of English and when he arrived at the depot he was completely at a loss as to where to go or what to do. Observing his condition the railway officers telephoned for a policeman and the boy was taken to the City Hall, where through an interpreter he stated that he left Midway, Washington, several days ago, and that it was his intention to come to Salt Lake on Thursday last, but that owing to the depth of snow he could not complete his journey until today. It was arranged, he said, for his mother to meet him at the depot on Thursday and, as he did not find her, he was obliged to return to his home, which he said was some miles from city but the direction he does not know.

When asked what his name was he wrote in German very plainly and in a manner which indicates that his education has not been neglected: "Adreas Dann."

## DETECTIVE FRANKS AND WIFE.

Judge Kane Dissolved Their Marriage. Zane Hinks This Afternoon.

The divorce suit of Edward Frank's ex. Nellie Frank came up before Judge Kane this afternoon. In his complaint Frank alleged that his wife was of an ungovernable temper, rendering her unfit to be the mother of his children, and he also charged her with cruelty. These were, however, made up of very flimsy material. In her answer and cross-examination Mrs. Frank denied these accusations and charged cruelty on her husband's part, alleging acts of violence, and that she was the mother of three children, one aged six and the other four years. The present suit was instituted eighteen months or two years ago, and during the interval repeated efforts

have been made to bring about a reconciliation, but without effect. The husband—who was not present—was represented by Judge Hinks. Judge Kane, on the other hand, testified more particularly as to the allegations of cruelty on the part of the husband. All the time the Frank's household seems to have grown out of the woman's life. Mrs. Frank's sister gave corroborative testimony and told of one occasion on which Frank seized hold of his wife's arm and threw her violently upon the bed during some work over land.

Judge Hinks asked no questions and said nothing.

Judge Kane granted the divorce to the wife, as prayed on the ground of cruelty, giving her the custody of the children. The Hinks allowed alimony at the rate of \$100 per month, payable on the first of each month, and \$50 attorney's fee.

Judge Kane said there would be no objection to Mr. Frank's taking access to the children whenever he wished to see them.

## JUSTICE TO ELLERBICK BROS.

No Shortness in Weight When the Coal Left Their Yard.

The short weight coal case which was set to be heard in the police court this afternoon and in which B. F. Deal, driver for Ellerbick Brothers, was the defendant, was continued until Tuesday next on account of the illness of Justice Cox.

Mr. Thomas Ellerbick says that when the ton of coal purchased by Mr. Thorup left his company's yard there was a full 2000 pounds, that it was weighed by the company's weighmaster and attested by the city inspector who placed his official stamp on a city certificate. This is the way the coal was weighed.

It follows, therefore, that the missing 470 pounds, or whatever the amount that was missing, must have been taken from the load—which remained at the driver's house all night—after it left the yard.

Mr. Ellerbick said that Isaacson, the driver, was not in the case but that he had been given the desired weight and he had been discharged. The company was not at all interested in the case now in court.

It is a pleasure to the News to make the explanation of what has been considered a rather curious case. They are shown to have been perfectly innocent of responsibility for or participation in the case of this complaint.

## TIRED OF LIVING.

John A. Chisholm Commits Suicide at the Magnolia House.

BY TAKING A DOSE OF LAUDANUM.

He Came to Salt Lake with Considerable Money a Month Ago and Has Been Drunk Ever Since.

A little more than a month ago a young man giving the name of John A. Chisholm took up his residence at the Magnolia house, No. 164 South Second West street. He appeared to be more than ordinarily well informed, had considerable money, dressed well and was very courteous by spirit of melancholy. Yesterday he was unusually gloomy, and said that he would be unable to endure his terrible affliction longer and told his friends in a half serious tone that they must take some measure for his relief.

He persuaded him to trace up and for a while he felt more cheerful and nothing further was said of the matter until 10 o'clock last night when it was observed that he was sitting by a stove alone. He had fallen forward on his head and he was breathing heavily. Several unsuccessful efforts were made to arouse him. The landlady at 10 o'clock found him and sent for a physician. Two of them came—Dr. Hinkley and Dr. Hinkley. Both of them worked faithfully for an hour and a half, but at 11 o'clock Chisholm expired.

Coroner Harris was notified and the body was removed to the morgue. An attempt to establish a case of suicide was found under the pillow on the deceased's bed and the coroner says that it was undoubtedly a case of suicide and that the body was not tampered with.

From letters in the possession of the deceased it is shown that he has a sister, Mrs. J. M. McDonald, at Magnolia Grove, Canada. In a letter to him from that place dated November 15th, of the present year, she writes lovingly and fully, and he in reply should be ever made a house of assistance to let her know and his wants would be supplied.

His mother and stepfather, who are said to be well-to-do financially, have been applied by wire of his death. They live at Hudson, Mass. The deceased had black hair and dark eyes, was 23 years of age and possessed a handsome face and figure and was of powerful build.
