That (though in the focus of a cholera epidemic the influence generating the disease is often felt by persons who are not actually attacked by it, and though, when the influence tends to render all within the sphere of it liable to attack, the emanations of cholera patients, like any other foul or unwholesome emanations, may operate as exciting causes of the disease) there are very strong reasons for believing that cholera is neither infectious nor contagious.

That though their exciting causes are numerous and various, cholera (whether "Asiatic," African, European, or American), the so-called "Cholerine," the "summer diarrhœa" of temperate climates, and the "Cholerainfantum" of the United States, are really one and the same disease; and that they are all, alike, essentially, invariably and exclusively, phenomena In the first-place no such editorial of preternatural excitement and action of the nervous system. 
