BREVITIES.

Seville, Spain, is to have a Protestant newspaper.
A colony of Poles propose to settle on a tract of 50,000 acres in North Carolina.
The Hon. Sunset Cox has been riding Arab horses in Africa, at the rate of 125 miles in 22 hours.
Two hundred and sixty newspapers are published in London.
Just as Mr. Peabody sets foot on our shores, the London people set up his statue in that city.
The citizens of Newport R. I., are building a splendid row boat for Miss Ida Lewis, the heroine of Lime Rock light-house.
A British soldier who fought against the "rebels" in our revolutionary war, is now living in England, at the age of 146 years.
A gun is exhibited in San Francisco which fires five hundred shots a minute, and a Portuguese has just invented one that will fire 800 shots.
Out of one hundred and twenty-three orders of honor only four can be worn by ladies, viz: the "Starry Cross" in Austria, the "Sainte Elizabeth" in Portugal, the order of Louise in Prussia, and that of San Carlos in Mexico.
Laura Reno, sister of the Reno robbers of Seymour, Ind., recently told a correspondent she should let God visit the murderers of her brothers with vengeance, but she was ready to render any assistance that might be wanted.

M. Ganier d'Abin, formerly a colonel in the Polish revolutionary army, has been appointed Commander-in-Chief of the army of the King of Siam, and proposes to organize the Siamese Infantry on the French system.
