Prof. White, in his communication of ... the 28th inst., fails to bring any argu- ... ment against my statement, that the ... articulation method, viz.: articulation ... lip-reading, with the sign method, ... has been conceded by the best edu- ... cators to be the best system for edu- ... cating deaf children, and that articula- ... tion should be primarily taught. What ... Prof. C. A. Yale, A. M. Ph.D., ... says of deaf children should be invariably ... taught articulation and a degree of ... lip-reading arrived at in speaking and ... reading before they are allowed to ... learn the sign method is taught them first ... by never learn to speak well after. ... The question may be asked, Can deaf ... children be educated to talk and to ... understand speaking people? I say ... yes. Were the question asked, Can ... deaf children learn to write and read ... and acquire a fairly good

education? I would say, they can. Mr. ... White's own case is proof of this, for ... he not only reads well but writes well; ... and I should infer from his writing that ... he is a fairly educated gentleman. His ... beautiful and accomplished wife, in ... point of education, appears to even ... better advantage, for she talks well and ... fluently, and readily understands all ... that is said to her by hearing and ... speaking people. Not a long time ago ... I met the lady, in company with her ... husband, riding out into the country, ... when she made some inquiries in re- ... gard to the road which they were to ... travel. Her language was plain, the ... words well spoken, and in turn she as ... easily understood me by reading the ... motion of my lips as I did her well ... spoken language.

Imagine my surprise when I found ... that Mr. White did not comprehend one ... word that passed between us, Mrs. W. ... acting as interpreter, and by signs con- ... veying to him what was said.

In referring to the taxpayers Mr. ... White loses ground, for the taxpayers ... of Utah want their taxes used for the ... benefit of all, and because an article ... can be bought at half price it does not ... make it as valuable in their eyes as ... one that costs double the money if it ... is worth incomparably more.

Mr. White again states that articula- ... tion and lip-reading are only for the ... favored few, and then goes on to say, ... "Ask Miss Rogers if it is not so."

Prof. H. B. Rogers A. M. Ph.D., if ... she is the one to whom he refers, says ... directly to the contrary: "All deaf ... children excepting the few who are ... really dumb, can be benefited by being ... taught articulation and lip-reading."

Of course, all of these children are ... not benefited alike by their opportuni- ... ties of education, any more than are ... hearing children.

Still Mr. White flaunts his sign ... method in the faces of the parents of ... these unfortunate little ones, and ... invariably tries to clinch his ... arguments by stating that life is ... too short to teach their ... children the (better) way, that is, to ... talk as other people talk and under- ... stand hearing and speaking people.

I said, in referring to my own child, ... that the progress was slow—but it was ... progress in the right direction, which ... no argument of the gentleman can ... controvert. I stated that in my opinion ... the University of Deseret had made a ... mistake in employing a deaf mute for ... the introductory teaching of this class, ... and see no reason to change my re- ... marks, but all the information I can ... gather from Mr. White's argument ... only confirms what I before said. His ... humorous allusion to Moses' mistakes ... by Ingersol are well enough, but the ... mistakes of Ingersol by Moses would ... be far more entertaining.

Life is not too short, art is not too ... long, and these deaf children can learn ... the art of speaking and the art of un- ... derstanding spoken language if they ... are taught primarily in a proper man- ... ner. I must agree with Prof. Jaucllet ... that the deaf mute, when educated, ... can teach deaf mutes, but their teach- ... ing should be confined to that class of ... deaf children who, through some con- ... genital or acquired deformity of the ... vocal chords and the organs of speech ... in general, are unable to make an in- ... telligent sound, and whose only hope ... of communication with their fellows is ... by the sign method.

DESTRUCTIVE FRESHET IN THE SOUTH.

A FLOOD AT ORDEWILLE DESTROYS PROPERTY AND ENDANGERS LIFE.

ORDEWILLE, August 26, 1885.

*Editor Deseret News:*

Not having seen anything in the ... News from our place for some time, ... and having just received

A VISITATION FROM FLOODS,

I will pen a few items. ... On the night of the 22d, I retired at ... 10:30, the water at the time in our fork ... of the Rio Virgin being 10 feet below ... a bridge I had just completed, and was ... awakened the next morning by a roaring ... sound, to find the water four feet above ... where the bridge was, within ten feet ... of my door and all around me. The ... water (if the mortal-like substance ... that rolled past could be called such) ... swept every bridge on the stream ex- ... cept the one in front of Orderville on ... the main road.

In what we call the Cove Field the ... flood destroyed fourteen acres of ... wheat belonging to Brother A. F. Hea- ... ton between one-third and one-half ... of which was swept entirely away and ... the balance damaged. Of six acres of ... corn a very small corner was left, and ... his potatoes considerably damaged. ... Stake Counselor Chamberlain also ... lost heavily in oats, barley, potatoes ... and carrots. My father and brother, C. ... N. and O. W. Carroll lost heavily in ... potatoes and carrots. Of a five-acre ... patch of potatoes fully 50 bushels are ... in sight, being washed out of the ... ground, and many more must have ... washed away. I had just hauled my ... wheat from a field where the main body ... of the flood swept by. It would not ... have left me a sheaf.

Bro. J. H. Losee is our bee man. The ... flood swept through his apiary entirely ... destroying five stands of bees and fill- ... ing others with mud and sediment. It ... also injured one of his team animals, ... took his wagon down and ran the ... tongue in a bank and securely staked ... it.

Brother J. S. Fackrell went to re- ... lease his cow and calf and returned to ... find the water in and around his house ... and had to carry his children waist ... deep through the angry raging flood.

Two blind boys, sons of Sister Eun- ... ice Brown attempted to save some ... bar poles and were in much danger.

Brother A. F. Heaton, besides his ... grain, lost a fine piece of seed lucern. ... Perhaps it will be necessary to ex- ... plain

HOW INDIVIDUALS IN ORDEWILLE HAVE CROPS TO LOSE.

Last spring or winter the farm was ... divided into small farms and leased to ... members of our organization. Hitherto ... we have sustained more or less dam- ... age each year by floods, but the loss ... was on all and not so much felt. Now ... we are brought to realize individually ... what a loss means.

I hear that the dam of the Mount ... Carmel ditch is swept out, and they ... will not be likely to have water in ... town this fall or winter.

Floods came down on the 23rd and ... 24th, but it was like striking a man ... that had been knocked senseless.

The health of the people is good gen- ... erally, and when it dries up a little we ... will be as busy as bees again.
