IMMENSE YIELD OF INHERITANCE TAX

Washington. April 11,-British In-heritance taxes, drawn from a popula-tion of 44,000.000, sield \$30,000.000 to \$95,-00,000 annually out of a total internal revenue of \$470,000,000 to \$480,000,000, About 4,000.000 estates pay the bulk of these taxes. This is the substance of a report by Charles M. Pepper, who has been investigating the subject for the hureau of manufactures, depart-ment of commerce and labor. Maurice Hewielt says: "A great tradition nes ended with Swinburne's life, and I wish there were signs of a new one beginning."
