Struck by Lightning .- From a letter from Brother George Farnsworth, of Mount Pleasant, Sanpete County, to Presiding Bishop Wm. B. Preston, we are permitted to extract the follow-

"On Saturday last about 1 o'clock y. m., the tithing granary of Moroni was struck by lightning. It commenced at the west end at the top, ran down about four feet to an opening, thence down to where the fan mill stood by the door, knocked down two men who had been cleaning wheat, then went out about three feet south of the door, tearing off the weather boarding all the way. It broke four pieces of 4 x 6 studding into kindling wood, and destroyed the gable end entirely. It rained heavily at the time, which fact no doubt preserved the building from fire.
