16 "A. P. U'S" FILE THEIR PETITION

Present a Long List of Names and Aske to be Placed on the Official Ballot.

ARE THE SIGNATURES CENUINE?

Careful Scrutiny Reveals Many Duplications Which May Cause Ticket To be Rejected.

Pursuant to law which requires new political parties to file petition for recognition within 30 days before election day, in order to have their ticket placed upon the official ballot, the "American" party Saturday afternoon filed such a petition in the office of the secretary of state. The law requires that the request for recognition be made by not less than 500 qualified electors and the petition filed Saturday is said to contain 300 such signatures. However, careful scrutiny reveals the fact that a great many of the signatures are either not genuine or have been duplicated in order to "swell" the list. This matter is being thoroughly looked into by Chairman Spry of the Republican state committee and if it is found that fraud has been resorted to, an effort will be made to keep the ticket off the ballot. As the time limit has expired, the "Americans" will be sadly up against it should it be proved that the signatures attached to the petition are not genuine. Here is the petition in full:

IRRIGATORS MEET.

Water Users Discuss Ways and Means At Memorial Building.

Some \$0 land owners and water users resident in Utah, Salt Lake, Davis, Weber, Box Elder and Cache countles, and southeastern Idaho, met Saturday at 4 p. m., with State Engineer Doremus and Atty, F. S. Richards in the B. Y. Memorial building. A committee was appointed to work conjointly with the state arid land commission in organizing the water users of different localities, including: A. J. Evans of Utah county John C. Mackey of Salt Lake county, James A. Eldredge of Davis county, William H. Gibbs of Boxelder county, I. C. Thoresen of Cache county and George C. Parkinson and L. D. Jones from the two districts in Idaho included in the scheme,

Mr. Doremus reviewed the work of the government, stating it had been ascertained that the general water supply of the state could be increased 1,500,000 acre feet from the flood waters alone of the Duchesne, Weber, Bear and Strawberry rivers; over 1,000,000 acres of land irrigated. Mr. Doremus stated it would be necessary only to organize into an association so as the better to meet the terms of the government. As the land involved in the proposition is mostly private proprety, it will need the co-operation the own-ers in order to carry out the provisions of the scheme. The government will survey and dig the cunals, and the tak-ers of the water need not pay a cent until they began to use the water. Atty, Richards made an eloquent talk in furtherance of the proposition, and it was decided to have the committee meet this afternoon, in the office of the state engineer to formulate a plan to lay before the water users of the territory designated.

It was stated in a morning paper that at the meeting a motion carried to take steps looking to the forming of a temporary organization. This is not cor-rect, as the idea was to form a permanent organization and to prepare ar-ticles of incorporation which would be circulated among the water users for their signatures. This was the purpose of the meeting called for this after-
