STOCKS DISPLAYED GREAT WEAKNESS.

First Sale of Railroads Showed Slight Gain Over Yesterday's Closing.

EVERYTHING WAS UNLOADED.

Declines of From 1 to 4 Points Made By a Dozen or More of the Representative Railways and Specialties.

New York, Aug. 31.—The stock market was quiet in the first hour of business. Opening prices were unchanged and St. Paul, Union Pacific, Reading, Amalgamated Copper and the United States Steel stocks sold at their former closing prices.

Stocks were unloaded at a rapid rate after noon and the list of times was without support. Declines of between 1 and 3 points were made by a dozen or more of the representative railroads and specialties.
