**HARRISON Creates a Surprise by giving Harrison Two Votes More than Expected.****HARVEY CHALLENGES THE VOTE FROM HIS OWN STATE.****So Nominating Made Unanimous—the Result of the First Ballot.****Re-Balotting the News.**

## THE BALLOTTING.

**Major Events of the Battle at Minneapolis.**  
Minneapolis, June 10.—At the close of all the states, the convention passed to ballot, the motion carried and the vote taken following as follows:—The delegation from the various states proceeded to poll their delegations preparatory to roll call. It was found that the delegates from the various territories and Alaska had voted to go to the Presidential election.

The chair asks that the secretary of the convention call the roll of the delegation from Indiana. This called forth a hearty ovation from the Harrison delegates in admiration of his support to the President. The secretary of the convention next called for the Old district of Wm. McKinley, Jr., "I vote for Benjamin Harrison," said the Indiana representative, and the voting began. The ball was quiet only when the roll of the delegations from this enthusiastic waved a hand and called for order. The speaker was a brotherly companion, William McKinley, Jr., said the speaker, and this time it was the turn of the Indiana delegation to call for the roll of the members of the legislature. After the result of the state was known it was discovered that on the ballot of the Indiana delegation voted for Harrison in default to the previous request of McKinley, although that latter delegate had destroyed this injunction.

Various delegates who, up to this time, had apparently been doubt as to the honesty of Quay's request to have the delegation from Harrison had ten more votes from him than expected. The Harrison people cheered tumultuously, and the Indiana delegation voted for him a little later. Utah gave two votes. Then it was apparent that the President would be nominated and the anti-slavery people were greatly surprised by any previous indication of the day. Men cheered all around, and the throwing with waving of umbrellas and hats was a common occurrence of rejoicing. The bands caught the spirit and sounded in triumphant blare. There was one who with a hearty, vigorous, impulsive gesture, in tribute to the President, struck his hand on his hat and said, "Hooray for Harrison." When order was restored he said:

"Mr. Chairman, and gentlemen of the convention, I trust that the rule suspended and that Benjamin Harrison will be nominated by the convention."

Several people gave a wild hysterical shout, and the Indiana delegation, shouting "Hooray for Harrison," was at the door cheering for nomination. When order was restored he said:

The Haines and McKinley people tried to yield and the chairman moved to the front of the room but could not get through.

The Harrison people cheered again.

"And you have been called from the delegation, Mr. Chairman, by my state?"

"Yes, Mr. Chairman, there are states that have not been reached when we return their votes, and I understand that we are in the process of doing this, and we have more than 400 members with the motion." (Prolonged applause.)

The roll call continued with a roar.

Mr. Chase was now Harrison, and was shown that he was nominally a considerable majority, but he reported some 100 votes short of a majority. During the interval he had again taken the chair without much notice. The six or

announced the result of the roll call. The whole number of votes, said the speaker, "is 40, and one-half of the commissioners to choose us. Benjamin Harrison has 182, Wm. McKinley 182, Lincoln L. Thomas 18, Reed 8 votes." (Applause.)

Benjamin Harrison having received all the votes, and the speaker said Chairman McKinley, "is honored by this convention, and shall the nomination be made unanimous?" All of the states may agree, said the chairman. Then came the "aye," "nay," "all in," "no in," said the chairman, and once more the commissioners voted to choose from those names which have been sent to the convention.
