## LOCAL BRIEFS.

**Women's Outing Set.**—The women of the First Presbyterian church will hold their annual outing at Lagoon on the 15th inst.

**All Halls Commencement.**—All Halls Commencement will be held on the evening of the 14th inst. in the Salt Lake theater. The college orchestra will furnish music.

**Dies of Scarlet Fever.**—Joseph Cranner, of Richfield, died on Saturday at his home in the Roman hotel, 240 South Main street, where he was quarantined on account of an attack of scarlet fever.

**Ninth Avenue Line.**—The survey for the Ninth avenue line has been completed, and stakes set for grading so that the track can be laid this summer. The Ninth avenue cars will run up B street and east to L street, within two blocks of city cemetery.

**Willard Mack Recovering.**—Willard Mack, the actor, is so far recovered from his attack of pneumonia, followed by an operation at the Holy Cross hospital, that he is no longer an inmate of that institution, but is staying at the Touraine hotel, where he is fast regaining his health.

# TRIBUTES PAID BY HIS FRIENDS

Those Who Knew Judge Henry P. Henderson Tell of His Unblemished Life.

## FUNERAL WAS IMPRESSIVE.

First Presbyterian Church is Filled With Those Who Loved the Departed—A Man Who Had No Enemies.

Before a great number of representative citizens of the city, who almost completely filled the First Presbyterian church, the praises of Judge H. P. Henderson were sung at his funeral yesterday afternoon by former companions of the bench, as well as by preachers who knew him in his every day life. His kindness, gentleness and charity hand, which he had in his every day life, which impressed those who knew him best.

Former United States Attorney C. E. Varian, who had known Judge Henderson for twenty years or more, was the principal speaker, and his address was a grand eulogy of the greatness of his friend. He sketched his early life and he spoke of the trust that everybody reposed in him, because of his unvarying fidelity, and the correctness of his views on all subjects. His disposition as a peace-maker was also referred to. His gentleness made him friends on every side. He had no enemies. Mr. Varian had never heard of it. His religion was to do all the good he could here, to try and encourage people to do right because the deeds of right living have their good effects in this life.

Dr. Paden also spoke especially of the natural kindness of Judge Henderson, and its effects on those who met him, while the Rev. James I. Goshen read passages from the Apostle Paul's writings on charity: "Though I speak with the tongue of angels and have not charity, I am as sounding brass," he said.

The services began at 5 o'clock, when the Knights Templar, Utah Commandery No. 1, removed the body from the undertaking establishment of J. D. Evans. The casket, which was literally covered with wreaths of flowers, was borne from the chapel to the hearse by the active pallbearers, who were: W. H. Kling, C. M. Allison, Jr., W. M. Bradley, A. C. Ellis, Jr., W. J. Barrette, E. B. Critchlow and James H. Moyle of Salt Lake City, and C. C. Richards of Ogden, Judge C. Zane, Judge R. S. Baskin, P. L. Williams, Judge L. Grand Young, H. J. Dinny, W. H. Dickson and Judge G. W. Barth.

The service closed with prayer by the Rev. Elder J. Goshen, read from the Bible. He was followed by Mr. Varian and Judge Paden. The honorary pallbearers were Judge Jacob S.
