WASHINGTON, 17.—The House

went immediately into committee

on the Indian appropriation bill,

the pending question being Har-

ker's amendment for the transfer of

the Indian bureau to the War De-

partment.

The chair decided the amendment

The House bill passed providing

nays 104.

The amendment abolishing the

yeas 112, nays 65. Other amend-

ments were agreed to without divi-

sion, and the bill as amended passed.

Managers from the section com-

mittee offered a resolution for the

investigation of the anonymous let-

ter in the Donnelly-Washburne

case.

McLane thought the resolution

did not present a question of privi-

lege, and moved to table it; rejected,

yeas 106, nays 55.

The House went into committee

on the whole on the special deficien-

cy bill, which McMahon explained.
