

Sherman, Evans and Shurz were also present. Messrs. Babcock, Ellis, Steward and Low, of New York, severally addressed the President, their remarks being to the effect that there would be a depreciation of the credit of silver were made a legal tender, and the national debt authorized to be paid in it; and further, that the passage of the bill would be injurious to all kinds of industry. The views of the speakers were similar to those presented last night before the committee. The delegation asked the President to exercise his power to protect the integrity of the country as to its credit before the world.

The President said that while, as they knew, there would be a manifest impropriety in now expressing his views upon this subject, he would do what they had requested him to do, namely, give to it a full and candid consideration whenever the question should be presented to him in an official form for his determination. After leaving the President the delegation called to pay their respects to the Secretary of the Treasury, at his office. The Secretary, in course of conversation with one of the delegates, said, "I hope, Sir, that your visit to the President has been satisfactory?" The Banker replied, "If we have done no good, we have certainly done no harm. We bankers and brokers can protect ourselves, but we desire that our fellow-citizens generally shall not be injured by such legislation as is proposed on the silver question." The Secretary responded, "I am happy to hear you can protect yourselves, while there is no doubt that others can do the same."
