WAIVED FROM WASHINGTON.

Disposition of Germano-Civil Ser-

vice Rules, Etc.

WASHINGTON, 20.—The following

communication touching the disposi-

tion of Germano and his fellow-capi-

tives, was this afternoon addressed to

Lieutenant-General Sheridan by the

Secretary of War.

WASHINGTON CITY, Oct. 19, 1886.

Lieutenant-General Sheridan, U. S. A.:

Sir—By direction of the President, it

is ordered that the hostile Apaches,

fifteen in number, recently captured in

Mexico and now at Fort Marion, Ariz-

ona, be sent to the United States Peni-

tentiary, at Leavenworth, Kansas, to be

kept in close custody until further or-

ders. These Indians have been the

of the worst crimes known to the law,

committed under circumstances of

great atrocity, and the public safety

requires that they be removed far from

the scene of their depredations and

guarded with the

STRICTEST VIGILANCE.

The remainder of the band captured at

the same time, consisting of eleven

women, six children and two enlisted

soldiers, you are to send to Fort Marion,

Florida, and place with the other

Apache Indians in the custody of the

United States Marshal at that place.

You will see that all the details and

arrangements for the removal and the

careful supervision of this band are

attended to. Very respectfully,
