In today's markets, a feature is the scarcity of last year's potatoes, and the absence of the Sacramento Valley tuber. The latter fact is due to the fooding of the Sacramento Valley so that local commission men say that no potatoes can be expected from that section of the country for the remain-der of the season, and Salt Lake will have to depend on southern California until early in July when the new Utah arop is due. So prices are saring up-ward. Old potatoes are \$2 per cwi, and new tubers \$4 per cwt. The lat-ter is an advance of 10 cents, and dealers says that by another weeks, the advance will reach 25 per cent. Butter is one cent higher, wholesale, being, 32 cents.

STRIKE IN OAK LEAF.

Another Beaver County Property Coming Into Prominence.

D. P. Rohlfing has received the pleasing information that a strike of considerable importance hass been made in the Oak Leaf property, situated in the Granite range of mountains east of Milford and judging from the last re-port sent hum by the superintendent of the mine, there are excellent reasons to believe that another product is to be added to Beaver county's list of paying mines. Hercules Property Being Developed by A Utah Syndicate.
