I helleve that his course has been accentable unto all who have know, him, nato all who have been interested in his life, and that it has been espec-tally acceptable to God. He has truly fought the good fight, and he has kept the faith, and henceforth there is surely isid up for him a crown of giory; for he is worthy to be numbered among the good that have dwelt upon this earth, and among those whose lives have been, it may be said, sacrificed, not only for his own advancemeht, but for the advancemest and good and exsitation of the people. He has labored for the good of maukind, as his writings and the fruits of his labors which may be seen in the Juvenile Instructor and in the various publications of the Church will testi y. i read these low words in order that the ground upon which we stand may be seen by those who are assembled here this afternoon. We stand upon the ground described in the words which I have read. We acknowledge oothing that is not ordained of God himsel', and that He has not commanded; we do not ackiowledge the authority of man, nor the right and power of man to suminlater in the ordinances of the house of God or in the Gospel of Jesus Christ, except as they are ordained of God and appuinted by him through his voice, or through the voice of his angels or ministering spirits which are sent to the children of men, and from them through those who are ordained of God under the bands of angels de-scended from the throne of Almighty God to administer in the liduse of the Lord and to prollaim the Gospel of the aud s lystion unto the children of men.
