Further Details of the Disaster to the Abyssinian Expedition.

ENTIRE BATTALIONS MANSLAUGHTER.

Indignation in Italy—Niger Crisis Born in Abyssinia—Rites in Various Places.

New York, March 4.—A special to the Herald from Rome says:

Details regarding the number of those killed are still wanting in the accounts of the disaster of the Italian troops at Adowa. The Italian had been short of supplies for eight days. A large number of officers despatched at the onset suffered from the want of food and fighting heroically. The Abyssinians, taking advantage of the disorganization of their opponents, massacred entire battalions, making use especially of their rifles. They cut off the Italian in every direction. Gen. Arimondi's brigade was surrounded and annihilated.

The military of war is overwhelmed with reports from relatives of those at the front. The Italian troops will not be made known for several days.

The survivors of the battle are wandering to the mountains covered by the Abyssinians. King Menelik is now preparing to attack Asmara. The Abyssinians are in almost complete control of the country. The king continues consulting with leading statesmen.

The greatest difficulties are put in the way of further operations. The king seeks to telegraph such messages as he has transmitted. Several dispatches have been forwarded by the king.
