Attorney, can fish up from the lower depths of infamy cannot convince tens of thousands who know those men that they are really guilty of such orimes. This conspiracy began with the advent ties to Utah. It crystalized under the agi lation of the Culiom bill which was drawn in Salt Lake. The object was to break lown the political power of the people who had conquered Utah from a desert waste into a beautiful garden. This was necessary to enable these malignants to occupy, possess and control it. With the fall of the Mormon power McKean, Woods & Co. were to bring Utah into the Union as a state, and become Senators of the United nates and heroes in a land already suffer-nation a surfeit of such. The Culiom Illi failed. Far fetched edicts of the law, ill. I failed. Far fetched edicts of the law, promulgated through stump speeches from the Bench, likewise failed. The sceptre, and yet grasped, was departing. Something must be done. Criminal statutes must be invoked. Proofs of crimes other than that if polygamy must be secured. But before this is permitted, in pursuance of a deliberate plan, decisions must be promulgated whereby, under a thin disquise, Mermons, in account of their religious beliefs and practices, must be excluded from juries which would be thus necessarily constituted of their deadliest enemies—men who would do the known wish, if they did not obey the actual behests, of their desperate masters. And this is but a brief outline of a conspiracy which aims, at whatever cost, to destroy men and institutions in a Tarritory whose civilizing and industrial schievements are the admiration of mankind,—Omaha Herald, Oct. 4.

MASSACHUSETTS. Fires-Burned to Beath.

Boston, 6.-The fire which destroyed the Fitchburg depot to-day caught from the sparks of an engine, and spread with fearful rapidity, the flames being fed by exploding oil casks. Miss Ada B. Andrews, copyist in the freight de-partment, was surrounded by the sud-den bursting of the flames and burned to death. Other persons in the same building narrowly escaped. Total loss is believed to exceed \$100,000, but it is impossible to give a correct estimate, as the contents of the cars in the buildings are unknown.
