FUNERAL OF HENRY LOSSIE

Southern Pacific Engineer Who Succumbed to Heart Failure on Friday at Terrace.

Republican Rally - D. M. Morrison Sues for \$15,000 for Injuries Received in A. G. W. Wreck.

The funeral services over the remains of the late Henry Lossie, who died at Terrace, Utah, Friday, were held at the Episcopal church in this city yesterday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, under the direction of the Masonic order. Rev. William E. Malson officiated in the services at the church. He eulogized the sterling character of the deceased. The church choir furnished sweet music. The Masons attended the funeral in a body and preceded the funeral cortege to the Mountain View cemetery where the order went through their ritual, and the remains were laid to rest in the family burial ground. The attendance at the funeral was large and many beautiful floral tributes were laid on the bier. Mr. Lossie was one of the oldest and most highly respected engineers on the Southern Pacific, and his sudden death, from heart failure, was a severe shock to his family and many friends.
