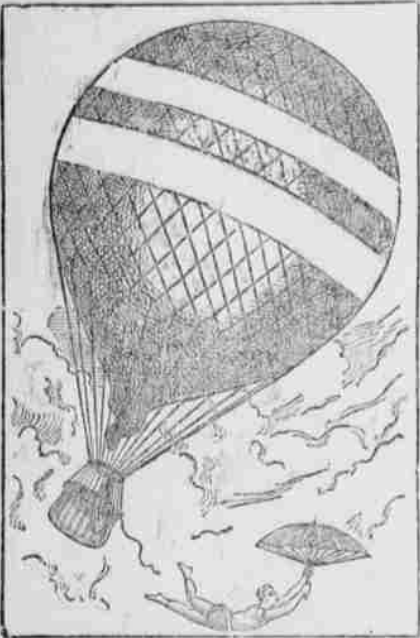

THE COUNTY COURT.

The Question of Officers' Salaries Called Up and Then Postponed.

PURCHASING STAMPED ENVELOPES

The County Clerk of Utah County Writes in Request to Leasing School Lands.

It was nearly three o'clock on Saturday afternoon when the county court settled down to business, the meeting having been called mainly for the purpose of considering the question of the fixing of county officers' salaries for the year 1893. The salaries paid for last year were as follows: Sheriff, \$2,200; county clerk, \$2,200; assessor, \$2,200; treasurer, \$2,200; county attorney, \$2,200.

After the minutes of the previous meeting had been read, however, Judge Blair suggested that the salary matter be postponed for the present, and this was agreed to.

Assistant Postmaster McBride attended the meeting and said he wished to know what the county intended doing in relation to a purchase of \$5,000 stamped envelopes for the summer which the office had ordered.

The amount of the bill is \$1,000, and Mr. McBride stated that they would either have to have the cash or return the envelopes.

After discussion a resolution was adopted appointing Peleteman Cahoon a committee to negotiate a loan in the amount needed.

No motion of Cahoon Albert Givner was appointed counsellor for West Jordan precinct.

SCHOOL LAND LEASES.

A communication was read from the county clerk of Utah county stating that the following resolution in relation to the leasing of school lands had been adopted by the county court at the county assembly:

Whereas, The Governor and Legislature of the State of Utah, on the 10th day of March, A. D. 1892, passed an act authorizing and requiring the respective county courts of the respective counties of the Territory to lease the school lands within their several counties, and to perform certain other acts in relation thereto, and
