FORTY-FIFTH CONGRESS.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 17.—Saulsbury

submitted a resolution calling upon

the Secretary of the Treasury for

information as to the amount of the

commission on other compensation

paid to bankers, brokers, firms,

companies, syndicates or individuals

for services in negotiating sales of

United States bonds or securities

from '82 to the present time; what

amount has been paid to any such

persons for services in negotiating

the sale of the bonds of the United

States; and also whether interest

has been paid on called bonds, and

at the same time, to remain on deposit in national

banks designated as depositories.

The resolution was laid over.

The Senate indefinitely postponed

the bill introduced in January last,

authorizing the killing of seal and

other bearing animals Alaska.

The credentials of Senator Thomas

of Alabama, were presented.

At the conclusion of the morning

session the Senate resumed consideration

of the bill to amend the patent

laws, the pending question being

on the amendment of Matthews

to strike out certain parts of the

committee's bill in relation to

damages for infringement and

insert other words.

Matthews said his amendment

having been adopted yesterday, he

would withdraw his amendment.

Davis, of Illinois, submitted the

following: Where an appeal is

allowed from an interlocutory decree

establishing the validity of a patent
