Court Refuses George Walton's Notice to Quit.

Tony George W. Walton, one of the litigants of the Third district court, received a letter from U. S. Marshal Brigham which reads: "I, for myself, compelled to see you resignation as valid to take effect Tuesday morning, the 17th inst. My reasons for this step seem to me to be good, and I take pleasure in stating that they are not in any way connected with any consideration of your character or fitness."

Mr. Walton, who is 25 years of age, served as a deputy under the late Marshal Dyer, and later, was appointed a constable under Sheriff Parson. He was removed in his capacity by Marshal Brigham whom that official took hold of the reins a short time ago. "George," by which title he is familiarly known here, has now made a favorable impression on court, and it is now well regard his departure.

BEAVER, Oct. 15.—Quarrels are apprehended.
