EDITORIAL NOTES.

Diamond cutting, which used to be a business principally monopolized by the Jews at Amsterdam, is now being successfully followed by young women at Boston.

There are 670,124 members of the Presbyterian Church in the United States. They are divided, however, into two bodies, the Northern and Southern Churches.

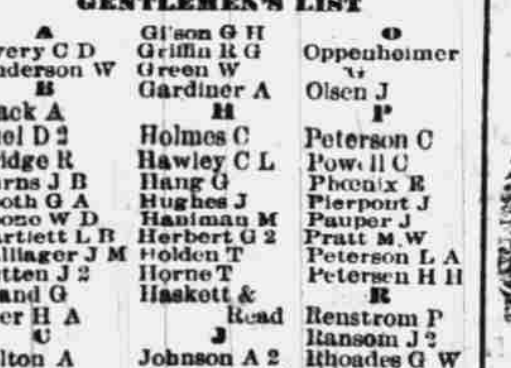
