HOW TO CURE TUBERCULOSIS. Chicago, Dec. 30.—"Any man in Chica-go, who has contracted tuberculosis. who is bine and despondent at the pros-pect of a prolonged journey to the mountains or to some sanitarium, or who because he has not the means to seek such cures, has settled down to accept his fate-I should like to have him come out and call on me and I will tell him how I cured myself." This is the invitation issued by Rev. Dr. Rufus A. White, who retured from active church duties several months ago and made a dogged and successful fight against tuberculosis. He will return to his pulpit next Sunday. Without leaving his home Dr. White rigorously followed what is known as the fresh air treatment, with high nu-trition and entire rest, mental and physi-cal with the result that he is now giv-en a clean bill of health.

ITALIANS AND SWEDES FIGHT UNDERGROUND
