Terrible Climax. Intelligence has reached the city that one of the men killed in the snow slide near Grizzly Flat, a mile above Alta, is Jared Pratt, aged between forty and fifty years, son of Prof. Orson Pratt.

The Snowslide-Fatal Cave in the Flagstaff. The following comes this morning: "ALTA CITY, March 13. Between 12 and 1 o'clock on Sunday a slide took place in Honey Comb Fork, killing Mathew Ingram and Jared Pratt."

Man Killed. The following comes this afternoon: "ALTA CITY, March 13, 2:30 p. m. James Isherwood, better known as 'Old Jim,' was killed in the A. & P. of Wales mine about 10 o'clock this morning. He fell some two hundred feet down the shaft. He was found alive and died on the way to Alta. Both his legs were broken, his upper jaw crushed in, and one eye protruding, and he was otherwise internally injured."
