## A DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

Indications of a Large Gathering in Ohio.

CLEVELAND, July 13.—Delegates to the Democratic State convention are arriving here and indications are that there will be a larger gathering ever assembled in the Buckeye State.

Although the preliminary meetings of the committee on nomination for the convention will not be held until Wednesday, Allen W. Chairman, son of the "Old Roman," will be the temporary chairman.

The other candidates for Governor Campbell will be recompensed on the first ballot, although the friends of Lawrence Neal insist that their candidate is the best. The following extract from among the Hamilton County delegates is so stout that it is very suggestive now, indeed, who could possibly harmony in the convention:

Governor Campbell's friends are complaining of the circulation of a report to the effect that he intended to withdraw from the convention, leaving the fight and that the Campbell men then will throw the nomination to McMahons of Dayton. The story evinces no general credence. On July 10, however, a small committee, ten or twelve men, said the McMahons were proportions which makes him, apparently, the only feasible opponent of Campbell. The platform of the McMahons and anti-Campbell may be combined under the battle cry of "Anything but Campbell," and the question was, whether the government was identified with him or not.

It is understood that the anti-Campbellites will struggle hard to create a division in the ranks of the enemy, but the chances of success are not favorable. Campbell tonight believes that Campbell will be nominated on the first ballot.

The platform is the subject of much discussion, but it is understood that the party will stand by its position a year ago on all the leading issues, continued Campbell's administration, denounces the Republican National platform, and demands the withdrawal of Congress for extravagance, denounces the McKinley tariff bill, and demands the reduction of tariff taxes. While the platform is not definite, it is believed to be largely open, and many conservative Democrats are urging that the Memorial question be not made an issue at all.

## WASHINGTON PARAPHRASES.

Report on the European Harvest.

WASHINGTON, July 13.—The report on the harvest prospects in Europe and other European countries have been received at the State Department from commercial agent Charles of Limerick, France, and Nathaniel Miles' Association. The report is based on reliable sources showing the field of wheat for 1891 being thirty-one per cent less than the forecast of 1890.

The information given by the sender of the report are reliable, but the following telegram suggests that it is not a better supply than reality exists. It is done with a purpose. They want to keep the market supply down in Mexico, and thus have a larger abundance to export. In conclusion the report says not only France but all Europe is looking longingly to the world fields of the United States.
