

MILLARD STAKE CONFERENCE.

The Millard State Quarterly Conference was held at Fillmore City, the 24th and 25th of November, 1885, President Ira N. Hinckley, presiding.

We were favored with the presence of Apostle F. M. Lyman and Pres. A. H. Cannon of the Presidency of the Seventies. All the Wards were represented by their respective Bishops or their Counsellors.

The reports of the spiritual and temporal condition of the Wards were good, harmony and good feelings existing among the working Priesthood, and an increase of diligence and faithfulness among the members.

The following brethren addressed the Conference: Apostle F. M. Lyman, Presidents A. H. Cannon, Ira N. Hinckley, Daniel Thompson, J. V. Robison, Bishops J. D. Smith, H. B. Bennet, A. A. Kimball, J. S. Black, L. N. Christensen, Thomas Yates, D. R. Stevens, Elders George Finlison, Hyrum Deweup, D. Olson and C. Anderson.

Besides the regular conference meetings, Brother Lyman (who arrived here on the evening of the 23d), attended Priesthood Meeting that evening and gave much practical and valuable instruction to the brethren, in his usual plain and impressive manner.

Brother Cannon arrived the next day, and the two brethren (Lyman and Cannon) also attended and addressed the priesthood meeting Saturday evening, the Seventies' meeting, after the Sunday afternoon meeting, when the 21st and 42d Quorums of the Seventies were reorganized by filling vacancies in the Presidencies and otherwise, also a conjoint meeting of the Mutual Improvement Associations Sunday evening, and again meeting with the Saints of Meadow Creek on the 26th at 10 a. m., and at Kanosh, 7 p. m. same day.

The main topics spoken on were: family and church government, the necessity of good examples by parents and the working priesthood, the "Word of Wisdom," parents should teach their children the principles of the Gospel and the impropriety of Church members marrying outsiders.

The addresses of the speakers were fraught with the power of the Holy Spirit, and much freedom of expression characterized the teachings and exhortations of the servants of God who administered the world, and a marked spirit of progression was manifested. The local authorities and the Saints in general felt blessed by the visit of Elders Lyman and Cannon, and highly appreciated the same.

The General and Local Authorities of the Church were presented, and unanimously sustained.


