Carter for Secretary of State.
BOSTON, Feb. 4.—A local paper will say that the belief is growing that James G. There is a good deal of the question over Judge Graham, whose appointment to the cabinet, after many months of delay, has been made by many Democrats. Dr. Graves Released on Bail.
DENVER, Feb. 4.—Dr. Thatcher Graves, convicted of poisoning Mrs. Josephine Harshbarger of Providence, R. I., and sentenced to be hanged, but subsequently granted a new trial, was released from the penitentiary today and arrived in Denver late this evening. He came here for the purpose of furnishing bail pending a rehearing of the case. Immediately on his arrival the formality of furnishing bonds was gone through with and the doctor was allowed his freedom. The amount of bail was \$5000. There is no probability of his ever being tried for the crime because of the great expense attached to a trial and the absence of witnesses.

Reduction of Freight Rates.
St. Paul, Feb. 4.—It is stated that as a result of the Trans-continental conference the new rate sheets will show a reduction in the St. Paul-Buffalo rates of 7 to 10 per cent. on the old tariffs. The present rates are made up of ten subdivisions, five of which are through and five commodity rates. The suggestion is that the 10 per cent. reduction will apply to the classes and 7 per cent. to the commodities. Under the old tariff the commodity rates applied to Spokane as to Portland the whole territory west of the former city being covered by a blanket rate. Strong opposition was made to this discrimination by the Spokane people with the result that the Interstate Commerce commission decided that the railroad should concede them 15 per cent. on through rates. It has not been found practicable to grant this concession, but it is understood on the bulk of the traffic Spokane will receive a reduction from 7 to 10 per cent. while the old tariffs will remain in effect as to Portland. This arrangement is subject to exceptions being made in favor of through traffic coming into competition with the clipper trade.

Bank Statement.
New York, Feb. 4.—The bank statement shows a reserve of \$1,918,000. \$4,400,000 specie decreases \$1,918,000. The banks now hold \$19,558,000 in excess of requirements.

Gold in the Treasury.
WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 4.—The treasury department today has less gold than at any time since the suspension of gold on January 1, 1870, and in the language of the treasury official, "the gold obligations are greater, with less than \$9,000,000 of gold to meet them." Two million five hundred thousand dollars have been engaged for shipment from New York tomorrow for Europe. Treasury officials do not venture a prediction as to when the outflow will stop, but state that they see nothing serious in the situation.

An Important Conference.
New York, Feb. 4.—President-elect Cleveland, accompanied by Don M. Dickinson, minister to the Netherlands, this morning and went to Cleveland's office. The greatest discretion was used in admitting callers and it soon became apparent that this conference was of more than ordinary importance. Among the first to arrive was Senator Charles F. Johnson of Kentucky. Later in the day the fact developed that Senator Sherman was present during the conference. At 1:30 Messrs. Whitney and Lamont joined the distinguished party.
