



There is much difficulty experienced in judging oleomargine from butter. We give two methods for so doing, and we are sure they will be welcomed. Procure a vial of oil of vitrol (sulphurle acid) which will cost about five cents. Use a glass rod, and put one drop on the article to be tested. Pure, fresh, yellow butter will turn almost white, while tallow turns to a deep, crimson red. Lard gives diversified colors, showing all the colors of the rainbow. Here is another test: Melt a very small quantity, in a shallow dish, which should be only large enough to hold the quantity and put a piece of wick in the fluid. Light the protruding end of the wick above the surface of the liquid; after it burns a few minutes extinguish the flame. By inhaling the ascending smake the odor of butter will designate pure butter, but if the odor is that of a smoking candle you may rest assured it is oleomargerine.—




