LOUIS, 15.—The question of re-counting the vote cast at the election last August for a new city charter is the plan for the city from the county, which has been before the circuit court by Judge Gottschalk ordering a re-count of the votes and appointing a board of commissioners to perform that duty in the presence of the county clerk.

FOREIGN AUSTRIA. The Reforms Austria Demands of the Porte. VIENNA, 15.—The Political Correspondence publishes a letter from its St. Petersburg correspondent which summarizes the reforms Austria intends to demand of the Porte, as follows: First—Disarmament of the entire population of Bosnia, Herzegovina and Bulgaria, without distinction of race, as follows: Second—The abolition of the irregular troops.

WEST INDIES. Disastrous Fight—The Spanish Troops Defeated—Catholic Priests Ordered to Resign. HAVANA, via Key West, 15.—Well grounded rumors are current here that the Spanish troops, who were sent to the Spaniards, near Puerto Principe. The newly armed Spanish troops are said to have been engaged in this affair. The Spanish forces retired to Puerto Principe. There is another rumor that the Spanish authorities have captured a boat near Barcelona with four irregulars on board, carrying correspondence from Cuban refugees here. New York to the insurgents here, stating that an expedition with arms, ammunition and money was on its way to the island.

MURDER ON THE HIGH SEAS. While the steamer Mochecuma, belonging to a line of steamers running between here and Porto Rico, was being out by the steamer on this island and at Puerto Plata, and while at the latter port, about eleven passengers embarked who, when the steamer was on the high seas, the captain, first mate, first engineer and supercargo, and took possession of the steamer. They then landed the rest of the passengers at Romeo Key, Cuba, and put the steamer back to sea. It is supposed that these so-called passengers were Cubans, Puerto Plata being full of refugees.

CREAT BRITAIN. Preparations for War. LONDON, 15.—The Standard's London special says the force which Russia will mobilize in accordance with the recent ordinance, numbers 195,292 infantry, 29,738 cavalry, 624 rifled breechloading cannon. The rifles are of the American Remington pattern. Because of the state of the weather, military men estimate that at least a month will be required before the above force can be concentrated on the Peath.

THE STOCK MARKET. NEW YORK, 15.—This afternoon the stock market broke, and there was a decline of 1 to 2 1/2 per cent. from the highest point of the day. The immediate cause of the decline was the rumors of riotous proceedings in New Orleans which, however, were not substantiated up to the close of business. The uncertainty surrounding the election deters many from entering into new engagements, and the failure of the trunk line officials to meet this week, as was generally expected, works injury to any speculation for a rise.
