

TELEGRAPHIC. ORDERED TO CRETE.

Two Greek Men-of-War and Some Torpedo Boats.

ORIGIN OF THE TROUBLE THERE.

An Extended Report that Mussulmans Had Massacred Christians at Akrotiri.

ATHENS, Feb. 6.—In the legislative assembly today the president of the Council, Mr. Del Yannis, announced that the government had ordered the men-of-war to proceed at once to Crete. The announcement was followed by a scene of intense excitement and enthusiasm. Minister of Marine Affairs ordered the fleet to start immediately, to leave for work tomorrow. It is stated that some torpedo boats have also been ordered to make ready for a possible trip to Crete.

The latest news from Crete is to the effect that fifteen vessels are already engaged in the work of transporting refugees to the Greek island of Minos. It was announced that the foreign consuls were urged to make their escape from Hania to Crete by way of sea.

Advices received from the island of Crete are to the effect that the trouble in Crete originated in an insurrection against the Mussulmans led by three or four Greek Christians settled in Akrotiri. When the report was received the Valt ordered troops to proceed to the defense of the Christian villages. The troops were attacked and it is reported that twenty persons were killed. Several villages were destroyed by fire. Crete is in a state of anarchy. It is estimated, however, that the Christians are in the majority. A considerable number of persons perished in the conflict. Finally the Valt ordered the soldiers themselves freed from the ramparts on the island of the Christians.

The Mussulmans set fire to the quarters occupied by the Christians in an attempt to spread the flames to the houses of the warships and to the arsenal. Three-fourths of the Christian quarters in the city of Candia have been burned to the ground, according to advices received from the island of Crete. The Christians, while trying to escape to the warships, were attacked by the Mussulmans and many were killed and injured. The number of victims is estimated at 300.
