THE PIONEERS OF UTAH. Mention the Utah pioneers, under President Brigham Young, set out from the Missouri river, in April, 1847. The war broke out in April, 1846, and the exodus of the Latter-day Saints from Illinois into the western wilderness began in February of that year.
