Resolution adopted by the board of health of Cedar City, Utah. Resolved, that in view of the widespread rumors concerning the sanitary conditions of Cedar City, we the un-dersigned, deem it advisable to make

the following statement: We have duly investigated the mat-ter, and find that there have been reported up to date for the season, only 14 cases of typhold fever. Seven of the patients have recovered, six are still ill, and one has died. The one death is the only death from any in-fectious disease during the present year. No new cases of Typhoid have been reported for several days, and from our experience of previous years.
