CITY COUNCIL.

Proceedings at the City Council on Tuesday evening, January 6th, 1880, Mayor Little presiding.

R. H. Irvine petitioned for the transfer of the liquor, billiard and merchant's licenses, issued to him for business at the Continental Hotel, to Mr. G. R. Erb. Granted.

A petition, signed by Mary Bentley, asking to be refunded the sum of \$5 for land in Flat B, purchased of the city and afterwards made a part of the Fort Douglas Military Reservation, was granted, and the money ordered to be refunded upon surrender of surveyor's certificate to said land.

The committee on claims, to whom was referred the bill of the 19th District for school tax on city property in said Ward, reported it to be their judgment that the law exempting the property assessed from taxation for school purposes, or any other purpose whatever, and therefore recommended that said tax bill be not paid. Adopted.

The committee on finance who were instructed to ascertain where and upon what terms sufficient funds may be had for immediate use in prosecuting work upon the canal, and report at this meeting, asked an extension of one week's time in which to make their report. Granted.

The following bills for the month of December were presented and allowed: Marshal's expense bill, \$290; expenses of fire department, \$192.65; gas for street lamps, City Hall, Fireman's Hall, and City Prison, \$1,083.90; boarding city prisoners—\$91 meals at 11c—79.01; guarding water tanks in City Creek Cañon, \$30; medical attendance at City Jail, and other services in marshal's department, \$30; collecting dog tax, \$22; janitor City Hall, \$16.

The following miscellaneous bills were also allowed: G. C. Ferguson, to winding and attending to City Hall clocks for the quarter ending January 6th, 1880, \$22.50; A. Gould, for coal, \$75.05; Latimer, Taylor & Co., for sundry items of lumber, during the past year, \$55.49.

The sum of \$1,500 was appropriated to road and street account, to be drawn upon the order of the street supervisor, and \$5,000 to the Jordan and Salt Lake City Canal.

Adjourned to next Tuesday evening at the usual hour.
