Provo, April 24.—Mrs. Anna Crane, wife of Frank Carpenter of the Fifth Ward, sank gradually into the last great sleep before the morn of her resurrection, on Saturday. The leaves husband and children to mourn. The funeral services will be held this afternoon.

CITY COUNCIL DOINGS.—CHINESE THREATENED BETWEEN SHEEP MEN AND COWBOYS.—NOTES.

Provo, April 25.—The city council held a session last night, and as usual the members were in their seats promptly at 7 o'clock. The following business was transacted:

The Chinese-Mormon Banquet of \$25 for chickens and turkeys drowned through breakages in the Provo waterworks main, and Jacob S. Baen for \$20 damages to fruit trees, etc., from the same cause, were referred to the committee.

O. W. Clark, city physician, reported that he was going to have the city, and recommended as his successor Dr. H. H. Allen. Referrals to the mayor.

W. D. Alexander, city justice, reported during the past quarter, 55 cases tried, \$22 fines imposed; 50 cases indicted, and 124 days of imprisonment served. Report accepted.

The street superintend was instructed to fill up the ruts and holes on the city streets.

The street railway franchises resolution was referred to the committee on judiciary and the city attorney.

The bill providing for the establishment of a graveling district, the said area of the city to be graded and gravelled, was passed.

## LOGAN.

E. D. Carpenter Falls Dead.—Elder Thatcher Improving.—Mass Meeting for a Railway.—Various Items.

LOGAN, April 24.—The board of education has advertised for bids for the \$25,000 in school bonds recently voted for. The bids are to be opened on the 15th of May, and are to be accompanied by a certified check for 5 per cent of the amount of the bonds, which will bear date of May 1st.

Zephaniah Collier was put in jail last week, as the U. S. commissioner would not approve the bond he offered on an appeal. A writ of habeas corpus was obtained and Collier was taken to Ogden to appear before the district court.

One of those sad occurrences that happen occasionally is related to us that in the midst of life we are in death occurred yesterday morning. Mr. J. D. Carpenter, a brother of Frank Carpenter, a leading member of the church known throughout northern Utah, left Logan for Lewiston on Saturday evening. As it was quite stormy when he reached Franklin, he concluded to remain there over night. On Sunday morning he failed to appear and down to Lewiston. When he did not get off his cart and open the gate. After the horse had passed through, Mr. Carpenter followed the animal to the stable where he kept the cart. There he found the cart apparently with the view of breaking the cart into pieces. While in the act of doing this he suddenly fell down. A young man named Lewis saw him fall and ran to him. Carpenter also came out of the horses stable and his husband and raised his head out of the pool of water into which it had fallen. He was carried into the house, but although he lived for a short time, he failed to be restored to life, as he could do nothing else at his wife. He died without speaking. Dr. Ormsby had been summoned from Logan, but of course did not reach Lewiston until after the death occurred. The funeral pronounced it a case of heart failure. Mr. Carpenter

has been a citizen of Cache county for many years. His home is in Logan, but he had temporarily removed to the intermountain cities, and resided at one time in Salt Lake City, and was superintendent of the Logan Penitentiary and Mountain sheep, later he was superintendent of the intermountain co-operative stores. He has married many remarkable persons, and was beloved by almost everyone. The body will be brought to Logan for burial.

Elder Moses Thatcher's condition appears to be improving at a very satisfactory rate. Grave fears were at one time entertained as to his final recovery, but he is now considered out of danger.

Miss Dieford and Mrs. Russell, who were arrested at Bainbridge, an attack which it was alleged they had made on Mrs. McRae and Mrs. Raymond, were exonerated by a jury. The injuries sustained by Mrs. McRae were slight, and it was agreed that the two women who were found to have entered out of the house and their injuries were received while other women were trying to eject them.

The entire issue of the \$40,000 of Logan city bonds have been received, sealed and returned to Blair & Co., New York.
