

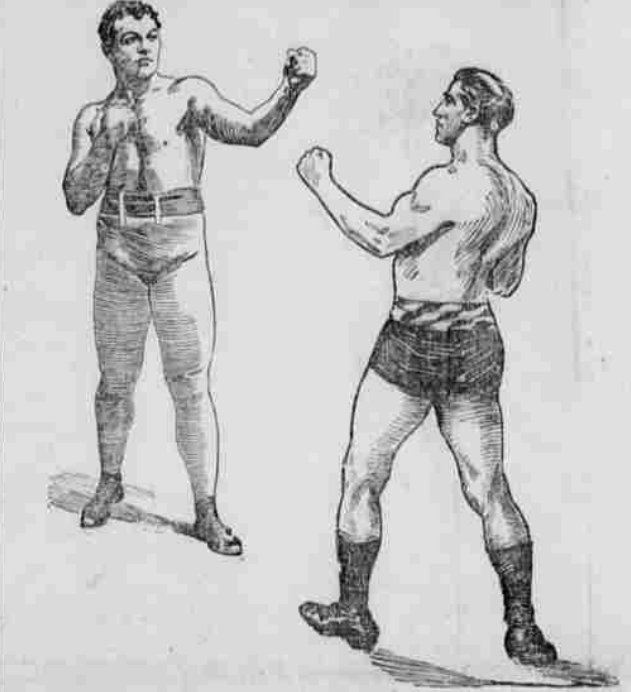
JEFFRIES GETS THE DECISION.
