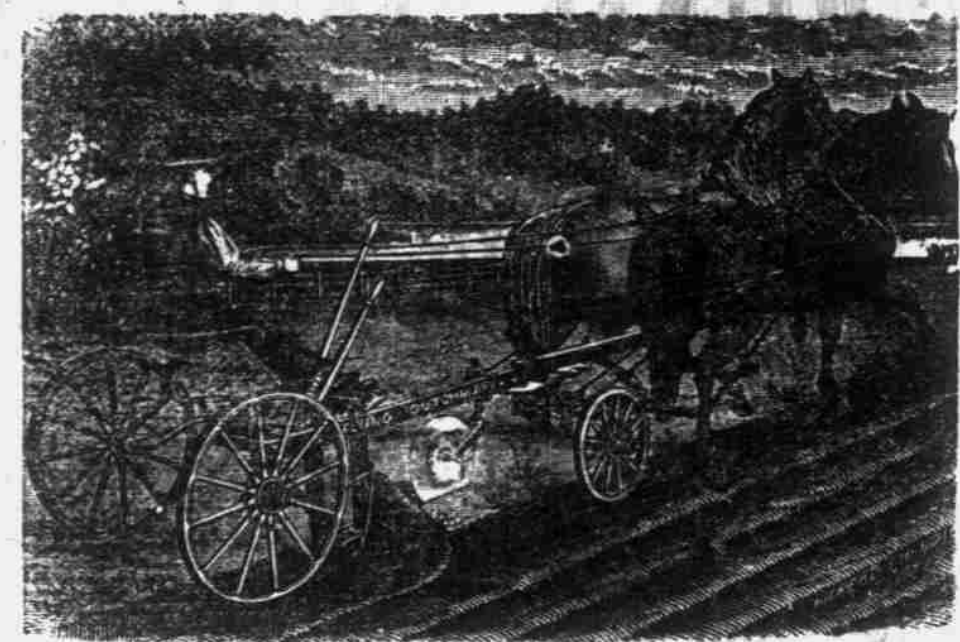


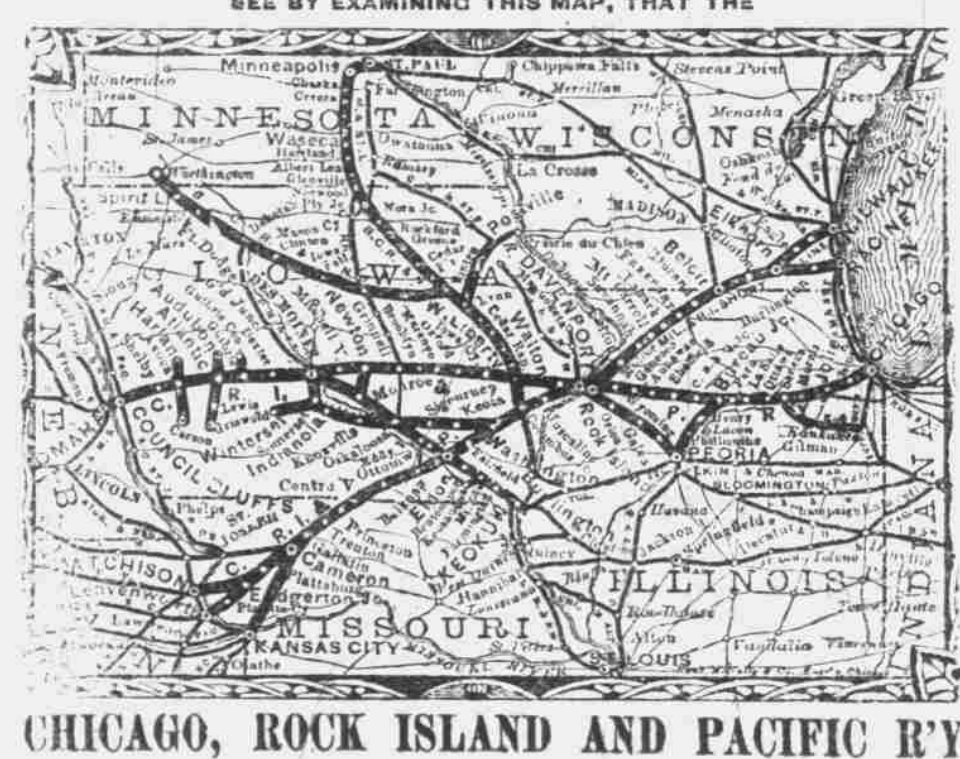

That paper says it hopes the example of Russia and Prussia will be followed by other countries to protect society against the acts of lawless criminals.

More Deadly Avalanches.
ROME, 23.—At Chialbrando every house is buried, and in some cases the names of the houses are covered by the snow. Scores of dead bodies have been taken out. In many cases they have no marks of injury, showing they must have been suffocated. Many persons rescued have been imprisoned in narrow and partly wrecked cellars for several days, together with the corpses of their relatives. Heated trunks have been sent from Turin with food and clothing.
