Sensational disclosures in a woman's trial for murder.

## DOUBLE MURDER AND SUICIDE.

Boarding-house Owner.—A Mexican Beats and Kills a Woman to Death.

It is to be a large brick edifice, trimmed with red stone, and will be 100 feet square. There will be offices for all the county officers in the building.

A mining man named Foster was in town this week en route to Atlantic mining district, says the Green River (Wyo.) Journal. He has a new process for extracting gold which promises to top it up in that district. He also claims to have abundant capital to lay and develop mines. We can tell him Atlantic don't want any new fangled processes, but practical mining men will be sure to give him a hearing to win their attention.

Burnett Phillips was found murdered near Mt. Pleasant, Arizona, the 8th inst. The regret received here may lead to believe that it was the work of the Apache Indians. Now it is thought that the killing may be due to the fact that Burnett had been engaged in the construction of the Graham and Hinsdale Trail, in which some thirty people have been slain. Phillips was in the employ of a stockman, Mrs. Barnes, who is handling the Graham cattle.

Nicholas G. Cannon, a Mexican, was arrested at Florence, Colo., on Wednesday, charged with the murder of a woman named Petrelina Hause. About a week ago the two attended a dance near Florence, and Petrelina did not return home. She was found dead, and in her room she had kicked her unconscious. She declared before dying that Espadas had done her to death. The murderer has been arrested.
