Asks Sanitary Inspection—The state board of health received yester-day, a telegram from Dr. J. V. Meicklejohn of Scofield asking that an inspector be sent at once to ex-amine and report on the slaughter-house there, which is claimed to be in an unsanitary condition and a menace to health.

Whitney Operetta Tonight—Mar-garet Whitney's opera entitled "The Sub," will be given in Whitney hall this evening under the direction of Prof. Edwin Kimball, who also made the orchestration for the work. Half a dozen electric fans will be installed through the hall to insure the com-fort of the audience.
