Home Again.—Elder Wm. C. Stables, church emigration agent, returned home on Saturday evening from the East, looking well and feeling in fine spirits. He reports very great improvement in business in New York and all through the East, the good effects of which will doubtless be felt out this way in a few months at the latest.

District Court.—Proceedings on Saturday, Nov. 13th, Chief Justice Hunter presiding. A. B. Mullhall vs. William Howard et al.; ten days' additional time allowed defendant. People, et al., vs. J. F. Graham; motion of defendant for a bill of particulars and for continuance. Motion for former allowed, latter refused.

Wm. E. Hatch et al., vs. U. P. R. R. Co.; case further argued before the court, and hearing continued till Monday. Mary Ann Anderson vs. George Anderson; decree for plaintiff. Nell Gillins admitted to citizenship. Forcible entry this morning. El M. Townsend vs. W. H. Hooper et al. Court delivers opinion in favor of defendant and orders judgment accordingly.

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Raid on Gamblers.—About 10 o'clock on Saturday night a wholesale raid was made on three gambling houses in this city, by the police, and the proprietors and inmates, to the number of sixteen, were all arrested, and subsequently released until 12 o'clock to-day. At that hour the parties arrested in one den were examined, and the case being clear, five were found guilty, one being discharged, as it appeared he was in the room fixing some window blinds. Four of this number were fined \$50 each, and from the fifth, the proprietor of the concern, \$50 was demanded.

The other worthies were to be attended to this afternoon, and will doubtless receive similar treatment. The open, bare-faced manner in which the "sports" have carried on their work has of late become flagrant, and even the police found no difficulty in entering the houses, in all of which business was in "full blast." The money which attended this raid, and the punishment and severity with which the guilty persons are punished, have spread great consternation among the knights of the gambler, and it is hoped will result in frightening away those out the country or into a more honorable career.
