We are pleased to learn that the work on this line is about to be commenced in earnest, for, when completed, it will be a great benefit to the community, by con-tributing, as it will, towards making Sait Lake City a great commercial contre-which we implicitly believe it is destined, at no distant day to become. Those em-barked in the enterprise have our warm-est wishes for the success of the undertak-ing. We understand that contracts will be advertised for in a few days, and we are in-formed that all persons desting to turnish labor or material for the construction of the line, and fake remuneration in the stock of the road, will have the privi-lege of so doing.

FINE AND IMPRISONMENT .- Yesterday James Turbitt, for selling liquor on Sunday, was fined \$100 and sentenced to imprisonment in the city jail for sixty days. The severity of the penalty inflicted was in consequence of the prisoner having been repeatedly guilty of the same offense, having been fined three times before on similar charges, and the third time was imlar charges, and the third time was im-prisoned thirty days in addition to the ine. Turbitt has several times declared his intention to fight the city, but he may find that it is a game that is neither pieze-ant nor remunerative before he gets through.
