WASHINGTON, 14.—Hale, from the
committee on appropriations, reported
the agricultural appropriation bill with
amendments. He said the Senate com-
mittee report was not clear, this being
the last appropriation bill sent over by
the House. Calendar.

The Indian appropriation bill was
taken up and several amendments
made.

After executive session, the Senate
adjourned.

HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 14.—When the House
met this morning, in continuation of
Friday's session, it moved that the
House go into committee of the whole
on the river and harbor bill, and pending
that moved that the debate be limited
to an hour and a half.

A session was ordered for to-morrow
for the consideration of the legislative
appropriation bill.

The regular hour having been de-
manded, the Speaker announced the
regular order to be consideration of the
pension bills coming over from last
night's session.

Will said it was clearly the intention
of the House yesterday to consider
this morning's session to the consid-
eration of the river and harbor bill, and
that the regular order be dispensed with, but
beed objected.

The first bill coming over was one
granting a pension of \$2,000 per annum
to the widow of Gen. Geo. H. Thomas,
and after debate it passed by a vote of
100 yeas and 90 nays.

Will finally decided to devote an
hour and a half to debate on the river
and harbor bill, when a discussion arose
as to how that time should be distributed,
and a long continued scene of confusion
resulted.

After considerable discussion, the
question recurred on the motion to
limit debate on the pending section of
the bill and one hour and a half was
half hours, which was agreed to, and
then the House went into committee of
the whole on the bill.

After discussion, and without action,
the committee of the whole arose, and
the House took up the river and harbor
proposition bill, under the operation of
the previous question.

Amendments increasing from \$4,000
