CONGRESSIONAL.

WASHINGTON, 5.—Morrill said

that he would do a great deal to

reduce taxation, but thought it

strange that Beck should want this

important resolution passed with-

out referring it to a finance com-

mittee. The navigation law, which

Beck denounced, was the same as

in '74. He denied that the poor

was oppressed and the rich favored

by the present taxation. The fact

that no people on the earth are

better than the Americans proves

that the tax did not oppress the

poor. He hoped that the resolution

would be passed, but that it would

be under the whip and spur of outside

influence. The removal of taxes

was a pleasant duty, but their im-

position was sometimes a patriotic

one. The motion to refer it to the

finance committee was agreed to with-

out discussion. Adjourned.

WASHINGTON, 5.—Riddle, from

the committee on Territories, re-

ported adversely the bill to estab-

lish the Territory of Pecos. Laid

on the table at the conclusion

of the morning hour.

A half hour discussion arose as

to the bill, which was to be con-

sidered. After a great deal of argu-

ment while Townsend was on the

floor, the speaker announced that

the discussion was entirely out

of order, and that it seemed to

be the public business should be

a remark from Townsend that he

did not want the chair to lecture

himself.
