Preparing for Service.

Preparing for Emergencies.

Washington, 14.—It can be stated on official authority that while the present naval preparations do not indicate any intention of Spain or Cuba, they are significant of the determination of this government to protect American interests in any hazard, and to prevent in future such massacres as those which followed the capture of *Virginius*. As nothing effective can be depended upon from Spain, notwithstanding its friendly feelings toward the U. S., it has been determined, heretofore, to meet all such contingencies, as they arise, instead of depending on Spanish officials for the transmission of communications from our consuls, either by letter or by telegraph. Naval officers will be instructed to inquire diligently and closely into the condition of the affairs of the island, and to report to the facts to the proper department. Our government is now waiting to hear what the Spanish government will do in response to our earnest protest against the outrage perpetrated against the victims of the *Virginius*.

Important Cabinet Meeting on Cuban Affairs.

The session of the Cabinet, today, continued over two hours, and was the most important which has taken place since the resignation of the administration. The capture of the *Virginius* and the barbarities perpetrated by the Spaniards against the sailors at Santiago de Cuba formed the subject of serious consideration, and a definite action toward maintaining the dignity of the United States in the existing complications was taken.
