solve them when their charters were

under the State Legislatures or their

organizations under State laws. It

had been confessed by the democratic

House ways and means committee, by

Chairman Mills, and those who stood

as an advocate of free trade, that

trusts had no possible legal con-

nection with the tariff. The Presi-

dent's charge that trusts had their

ground in all things was exactly the

same as the charge that trusts had

no place in a national campaign. They

are state issues, and the republi-

cans of the State can be de-

pendent upon to look after them in

their own State.
