The excavation for the tanks and the pipes has been very difficult, being mostly through very firm limestone, gravelly concrete, ex ceedingly hard to work in. The channel for the pipes varies from five to twenty-one feet deep. In the deeper cuts it has been found more convenient and less expensive to run tunnels, five by four feet, with shafts at short intervals. An arrival of piping is expected daily.
